Dedicate Calvary Gift

Church Window Honors Cleric

To the memory of a man who served Calvary United Church for a quarter century—despite the fact he had retired from the active ministry after serving a number of rural congregations, a stained glass window was unveiled yesterday by his widow.

The man was the Rev. Dr. Allan H. Brown, scholar and theologian who came to retire in South London in 1928 but who continued an active interest in church work until the time of his death in 1951.

Mrs. Brown unveiled a window in Calvary Church depicting King David.

Dr. Brown was a Doctor of Sacred Theology from McGill, a Doctor of Literature from Atlanta University, Georgia, and a Doctor of Laws from Indianapolis University. He served in charges at Pelee Island, Arkona, Ailsa Craig, Belgrave, Trowbridge, Walton, Kerwood and Oil Springs.

Many of his relatives and friends were present with Mrs. Brown yesterday, including the Rev. C. L. L. Couzens, of Forest, a nephew, and the Rev. C. R. Durant, a retired minister living in London, a family friend.

The prayer of dedication was said by the church minister, the Rev. Elgin Turnbull, who later preached a Thanksgiving sermon based on the 133rd Psalm, "Bless the Lord, O My Soul."
