

Calvary United Raises \$47,000

Of \$47,000 raised by all organizations of Calvary United Church last year, 37 per cent was given to missions, charities and other benevolences outside the church, the Rev. E. G. Turnbull reported at the annual meeting.

He said there are 1,417 active members of the church and 2,500 under pastoral oversight.

The congregation also decided: To establish a system of scholarships payable to members training for full-time church work at either a United Church Theological College or United Church Training School; to set up a special fact-finding committee to survey the congregation's needs over the next few years and make policy recommendations to the official board; and learned that the European family brought to Canada with church money two years ago is now completely integrated into Canadian life; that a Rover Scout crew had been organized during the year and five new stained glass windows were installed.

Plans are also under way for installation of a Boy Scout window in 1956.
